Demons + root of bitterness = many dead people Part 1

"The question isn't why an all-powerful God allows tragedy to happen; the question is what is wrong with us that we take the freedom God made us with and use it for tragedy?" – Steve Deace

THIS is the column I've been procrastinating on writing. Through personal experience, I've been forced to study the subject of mass shooters. I knew one. I even traveled with him to events and shared motel rooms with him. In the middle of March 2005, he shot and killed seven of my close friends and himself during a church service. I was on my way there, but due to a car problem I turned around and went home. I lived to write another day.

Ironically, on New Year's Day that year, I had posted a column entitled "Why does God allow such things to happen." To the end of his life, the leader of our church wondered why such a thing happened. Could it be that God allowed it so that some of us could relate to the victims and survivors of mass shootings, and to enable us to find causes and solutions?

The apostle Paul warned us very strongly about allowing a root of bitterness to take root in our minds.

"...some commonalities do stand out. A 2016 study published by psychologist Dr. Peter Langman revealed that 82% of the perpetrators of mass shootings came from broken homes with seriously dysfunctional families where 'not just divorce and separation, but also infidelity, substance abuse, criminal behavior, domestic violence, and child abuse' were present.

The shooter in our case lived with his divorced mother. He had been bullied on the school bus years ago, something we didn't know. I saw his temper, and sadly offended him once. His defense mechanism was humor, but life was getting tougher for him, not better. And *finally*, we believe, he was possessed by a demon. A judge's husband had been shot in Chicago a few days before, and the killer drove to Milwaukee. A cop thought he was parked suspiciously and approached him, and the guy committed suicide. Unfortunately, that doesn't kill the demon. And it looks for someone else to possess. We believe it found Terry a few miles away, and the rest is history. A few days later an Indian school in northern Minnesota was shot up, probably by the same demon. The shootings in 2022 ought to convince us that America needs a great spiritual Awakening. If not now, WHEN? Here's the column I wrote a couple of months before the 3-12-05 Brookfield shooting:

"Why does God allow such things to happen?"

"If there is no God, what makes the next Kleenex pop out?" - anonymous

"If God allows such things to happen, He must be cruel." — anonymous

I RECENTLY mentioned that I think we are living in the time described by the Bible as "the time of the Great Hatred" (Hosea).

"... For nation shall rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom, and there shall be famines and pestilences and earthquakes in diverse places ... And then shall many be *offended*, and shall betray one another, and shall hate one another." — Matthew

Atheists, agnostics, and doubting Thomas's do not "feed" on the WORD (instead they focus on talking points, catchphrases, and non sequiturs). In recent years, almost any pithy or overused phrase might end up being referred to as a non sequitur, but I'm talking about the original meaning: in logic: a conclusion or inference which does not follow from the premises. Darwinism is such an "inference"! It was even based upon deliberately chosen faulty premises, which is even worse. Start with a fallacious premise and you will end up with fallacious conclusions, *given enough time*!

Mental health, demons, and shootings Part 2

I DIDN'T PLAN to post a column today, but I just wrote something interesting on Facebook and one thing led to another. I take homicides and mass shootings personally, because as I said, I lost seven good friends plus the shooter-friend who obviously had "issues." I can count a total of at least 12 people who were friends or neighbors who were murdered. As I said, there wasn't a single murder in our county during the decade of the 1950s! I think you know what has changed: coddling of criminals, failing public schools that never *flunk* anyone anymore, and the decline in religion as a factor in the

culture of society. This week I'm going to focus on mental health. That's one thing that can certainly be treated. Here's the piece I wrote this morning on my Facebook timeline:

Speaking of mental health, I just read a good article in Reader's Digest's large print edition, May 22, which I got free at the library the other day: "A baseball player's second chance." He was from Las Vegas and signed with the Texas Rangers in 2010 (his brother was drafted by the Brewers in 2006).

Drew Robinson made the majors in 2017 but was shuttled back to the minors a few times. In June he hit a homer for his first hit in the "bigs." He got traded to St. Louis but had to have elbow surgery in 2019. The Giants then took a chance on him, but the virus shut down baseball in 2020. A week later he bought a gun and shot himself. He lived at home without medical care for about 20 hours. He thought about trying again, to shoot himself, but after taking a Tylenol he took that as a sign that he wanted to live. With much medical care, of course.

"He could be loud, bombastic, always trying to look and act cool. But neither Daiana nor the world could see Drew how he saw himself – not as the jokester but as the joke."

The 9mm bullet had taken out his right eye and exited his left cheek, just missing his other eye. He thought about trying again, but after taking a Tylenol, he took it as a sign that he wanted to live, and he called 9-1-1.

"Hitting major league pitches with two working eyes is extraordinarily difficult. Doing so with one is next to impossible. "

But he began to work out again, and on October 21, 2020, 6 months after his "suicide," he hit a ball over the fence at the Las Vegas Park local pros use for batting practice in the off-season. He had spoken to the Giants staff and players in September about mental illness. On the day after he had hit that ball out of the park, he got a text from manager Gabe Kapler and was given an invitation to go to minor league spring training.

He actually played half a season for the Sacramento River Cats before retiring. I had heard of Gabe Kapler before, but not the River Cats or Drew Robinson – and I used to be into baseball. I hope the story gets wider exposure because Drew wants to help other people.

I know a guy who had problems with such issues and who was helped by the story of Boston's Jim Piersall in the 1950s. "Fear Strikes Out" was a book that was made into a movie (well worth reading or watching again!).

Drew Robinson ended up working for the Giants' front office as a mental health advocate. He still has the bullet that "changed his life." Sometimes he'll take it out of the box and say:

"I'm stronger than you. I'm stronger than I thought I was."

Part 1 of this article is talking about the March 12, 2005, shooting at the Living Church of God Services in Brooklyn, Wisconsin by Terry Ratzmann. "Why aren't the preachers today telling their people the truth?" I heard blasting from my radio. I was on the way home after finishing my shift as a maintenance electrician at a well-known oil tool products plant when I was forever changed by those words.

In my less-than-completely-sober state, I remember shouting back at my radio, "Yeah, buddy! Let them have it!" And, just what was the topic over which the radio personality was lambasting preachers? It was the commandment to keep the Sabbath holy as stated in Exodus 20.

To be honest, the beginning of the change in my life happened when I was in the 7th grade at Good Shepherd School, a long-time Catholic educational facility in my hometown. It was sometime during that year that the nun who taught the class explained to us how to look up scriptures in the Bible.

Of course, it was the Imprimatur version authorized by the Church in Rome, but it contained a reliable version of Exodus 20. "I want to show you how to find the commandments in the Bible" she had told the class. All of us were told to find the book of Exodus and then to find the 20th chapter.

As we read aloud in class, working our way through the scriptures, we came across the commandment that did not read the same as the Catholic catechism, which states that the 4th commandment was to keep the Lord's Day holy. I spoke up in class, asking the obvious question, "Why does the bible say Sabbath Day instead of Lord's Day like the catechism does?" The nun responded honestly stating, "The Sabbath Day is Saturday, but our Holy Father has changed it to Sunday. We are still supposed to not work, except on Sunday now."

I remember thinking to myself, "Who is a man that can change the law of God?" Even then I understood that it did not make sense that God would make a command, call failure to keep it "sin," and then just let some man change it. It was then that I recognized the hypocrisy of the Catholic Church, which I transferred to all other churches which kept that same day. It was almost immediately a consequence of that question that I was removed from being an altar boy at any service time, an honor that had become a symbol of the hypocrisy I was quickly coming to be disgusted over.

I managed to finish the 8 years at that school, but when given the opportunity to exit that system I jumped onto it.

My disdain for all churches continued until that fateful night in the spring of 1982 when I heard that voice from the radio lambasting today's preachers. His topic, God's Sabbath Day, grabbed my attention and when I arrived at our home, I sat in my car listening to his message. My wife, wondering why I had not come into the house, went out to find me sitting and listening. She joined me and it was then that we both began the changes in our lives leading us to today.

The initial change in our lives was the opening of our minds to understand that God was still present, and that He had His Church continuing to keep His Sabbath Days as He had commanded so long ago. I had long ago forgotten that day in the classroom when I first read about keeping the Sabbath holy, but now the memory came rushing back, reminding me that I'd seen the lie so long ago. It was with praise for God that I considered that I had been right so long ago, and yet with sadness that I further realized that I had also abandoned the rest of the admonitions of Exodus 20 in my disgust over the hypocrisy.

As I said, that was the beginning of the changes in our, my wife and myself, lives. As I learned more about the Way of God, it became clear that there was a lot more to obeying God than the letter of the law found in Exodus 20. One of the scriptures that stuck with me early on was in Matthew 6:33, "But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness; and all these things shall be added to you." I had been laid off from that same job due to the oil crash of the early 80s. I needed a job and worried about how we would make ends meet, but that scripture told me where my priority should lie. We always were able to pay the bills and provide enough food for the family—and we were able to dive deeply into a course of study that led us to a greater understanding of God's law.

Still, we had some understanding, but were continuing to do the things that we had been doing, except that we began trying to keep the commandments as best we could. One funny thing that we did, in our poor understanding of the command against idols, was to gather up bowling trophies, animal-image curios and even pictures in our Catholic bible (given to us by a well-meaning priest at our marriage) and then to destroy them. We laugh at that now, but it led to our greater understanding of this scripture, found in Acts 5:32, "And we are His witnesses of these things. And so also is the Holy Spirit, whom God has given to those who obey Him."

We were obeying in a naïve way, but we were trying to obey—and God honored that, as He has done in so many other ways over the years, patiently waiting for us to come to a greater understanding and then to do that which is pleasing in His sight.

Eventually, I found a job. We were blessed in that my wife had a job that only required her presence during the normal work week. But, when I found a job, the Sabbath immediately became an issue. This new job was at a 7 day a week establishment. When I interviewed for the position, I was led to be honest about the fact that I would not be available from Friday sunset until Saturday sunset, but that I was willing to work any other hours that they wanted me to work. I was given a job and a location to which I was to report. I was doing the best possible job I could do when, after a few weeks, the management of that location decreed that I should work Friday night. After explaining that I'd explained during my interview that I could not work on God's Sabbath, and when those hours were, it was reiterated to me that I was to work Friday night. God gave me the strength to say, "Then I guess I'm out of a job because I'm not going to work on the Sabbath."

But almost immediately the manager said "I guess you are serious about it then." The schedule was changed and as long as I worked there the schedule no longer listed me for the hours of the Sabbath.

God has led us to greater and greater understanding as we have continued in His Church. One great trial in which He was faithful to keep us safe from deception was the collapse of the Worldwide Church of God (WCG) due to the decision by the heretic Tkach father and son duo to adopt the idea that we are not actually required to keep God's Sabbaths anymore. Knowing what you now know about my disgust for hypocrisy in churches, you can imagine our reaction to the Tkach announcements. God continued to lead us, this time out of the WCG and into the United Church of God (UCG). However, the seeds of mistrust were sown, and when it became clear that UCG intended to continue in some of the erroneous dogma of WCG, we bid that organization adieu, also.

Now, we pastor a small local congregation that remains faithful to the faith once delivered, and which studies to find that which is good, holding it fast.

Are we perfect even now in our understanding? I think not, but I'm content to study, meditate, pray and fast while God continues to open our understanding to ways to rightly divide the word of truth.



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Thomas Jefferson's Prominent Role in Ending Slavery in America

Thomas Jefferson is in the crosshairs of those on the Left who are demanding the removal of his statues from public places and the removal of his name from public schools. After all, was not Jefferson an evil, white slaveowner?

We must remember that the goal of the Left is not to understand history. Their goal is to control history and shape it to drive their social/political agenda. As the character in George Orwell's *1984* learned, "Whoever controls the past, controls the future."

The truth is that at a time when slavery was accepted and practiced in Africa, Asia, the Middle East and most of the world, Jefferson, and virtually all of America's Founders turned against it. This is clear from both their public statements and their private correspondence. The eminent economist and historian, Dr. Thomas Sowell, who happens to be Black, has written of this saying,

Among those who turned against slavery in the 18th century were George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Patrick Henry, and other American leaders. You could research all of 18th century Africa or Asia or the Middle East without finding any comparable rejection of slavery there (Hyatt, <u>1726: The Year that Defined America</u>, 90).

The occasion for this unique turn was the 18th century religious movement in colonial America known as the Great Awakening. A characteristic of this Awakening was the anti-slavery sentiments that prevailed throughout the colonies. By the time of the writing of the Declaration of Independence in 1776, virtually every Founder had come to agree with John Adams who said,

Every measure of prudence ought to be assumed for the eventual total extirpation of slavery from the United States . . . I have throughout my whole life held the practice of slavery in abhorrence (Hyatt, <u>*Abolitionist Founding Fathers*</u>, 36).

Jefferson was the primary author of the Declaration of Independence and the nation's third president. Although born in a slave-holding state and into a slave-holding family, he came to see the evils of slavery and began calling for its elimination, even while holding slaves.

For example, in a document for Virginia delegates to the Continental Congress, Jefferson called for an end to the slave trade, writing, "The abolition of domestic slavery is the great object of desire in these colonies where it was unhappily introduced in our infant state."

In an early draft of the Declaration of Independence, Jefferson excoriated the King of England and accused him of introducing slavery into the colonies, saying,

He has waged cruel war against human nature itself, violating its most sacred rights of life and liberty in the persons of a distant people who never offended him, captivating them and carrying them into slavery in another hemisphere (Hyatt, *Abolitionist Founding Fathers*, 44).

Although the exact words of the above statement did not make it to the final draft, the principles of "life and liberty" for "all men" did. Jefferson wrote,

We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty, and the pursuit of Happiness.

America's founding generation understood this statement to be a direct attack on the institution of slavery, and abolitionists used it in their attacks on that institution. The famous abolitionist and former slave, Frederick Douglass (1860-90), understood it as such. In a July 4th speech in 1852, Douglass referred to the Declaration of Independence and then exhorted his audience,

The principles contained in that instrument are saving principles. Stand by those principles, be true to them on all occasions, in all places, against all foes, and at whatever cost.

In his early years Douglass had concluded that he had no place in America because of the existence of slavery, but after years of investigative research he completely changed his thinking. He realized that the continuation of slavery was not the desire of the Founders and that they had put their lives on the line by declaring independence from Great Britain and challenging slavery by declaring that "all men" are created equal and have a God-given right for Life, Liberty, and the Pursuit of Happiness.

That is why, in the same speech, Douglass showed his high esteem for Jefferson and all the Founders, saying,

Fellow Citizens, I am not wanting in respect for the fathers of this republic. The signers of the Declaration of Independence were brave men. They were great men too—great enough to give fame to a great age. It does not often happen to a nation to raise, at one time, such a number of truly great men (Hyatt, <u>Abolitionist Founding</u> <u>Fathers</u>, 52).

Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. also understood Jefferson's words in the Declaration to be an attack on slavery. When someone suggested to him that he was an "extremist," King replied, "Was not Thomas Jefferson an extremist? – 'We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal'" (Hyatt, *Abolitionist Founding Fathers*, 45).

Indeed, in the 18th century, when slavery was accepted and practiced throughout the world, the words of Jefferson were considered "extreme." When understood in the context of the times, Jefferson and America's Founders were on the cutting edge of human society in advocating for the abolition of slavery and liberty for all mankind.

This is why, in his iconic "I Have a Dream Speech," Dr. King could declare, "I still have a dream; it is a dream deeply rooted in the American dream." In the same speech he went on to say,

When the architects of our Republic wrote the magnificent words of the Constitution and the Declaration of Independence, they were signing a promissory note to which every American was to fall heir. This note was a promise that all men, yes, black men as well as white men, would be guaranteed the "unalienable Rights" of "Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness."

Dr. King made it clear that the problem the nation faced was not with the Founders or her founding documents, but with the fact that succeeding generations had not lived up to the vision of equality and liberty the Founders had enshrined in those documents.

Abraham Lincoln also believed that succeeding generations had failed to follow through on the vision of the Founders for

life and liberty for all men. In 1858, Lincoln, who had become the just formed Republican party's first candidate for president, declared that the anti-slavery vision of the new party was the same as that of the nation's Founders. He said,

In the way our Fathers originally left the slavery question, the institution was in the course of ultimate extinction, and the public mind rested in the belief that it was in the course of ultimate extinction. All I have asked or desired is that it should be placed back again upon the bases that the Fathers of our government originally placed it upon (Hyatt, *Abolitionist Founding Fathers*, 59-60).

The Founders were not perfect, but when judged in the context of their times, they were, as Douglass said, brave men. It is, therefore, high time for this generation to cease in its efforts to smear and cancel Jefferson and the other Founders and begin living up to the vision of Life and Liberty for all that they envisioned and enshrined in America's founding documents.

God preserved my life when I was tossed from my moped onto the railway track one day in August 1993. The person operating the railway-gate was a novice and lowered the second bar before I had crossed it and so it hit me on the chest and knocked me down. I lay on the railway track, unconscious for a while - I don't know for how long. Someone picked me up before any train came along. I now feel like one who has come back from the dead (for my fall could have been fatal).

"A spirit of thankfulness can deliver you from many prisons."

It was a fresh reminder to me that I owe my life to God for the rest of my days. I cannot spend my time or energy or money as I like. I cannot read what I like. I cannot speak whatever I like. Everything has to be determined by what will glorify God. Such a life will not be a strain to live (as Satan would have us believe) but will be the most glorious life anyone could ever live - for that is how our Lord lived. You also have had experiences on the roads when you could have had fatal accidents. But the angels of God protected you. So, your debt to God is similar. Praise the Lord for preserving our lives. May we live as those who have been raised from the dead.

My hand and shoulder that were sprained after the accident, came 95% back to normal, within 3 weeks after the accident. That was a miracle, for which I thank God. One of the things that I learnt during those 3 weeks was not to take the ordinary things of life for granted - even the ability to raise my hands when praising God, which I could not do during those 3 weeks. For the first time in 54 years, I thanked God for the privilege of being able to raise both my hands when praising Him. Until then I had taken that action for granted. That made me thankful for the use of many other parts of my body as well - like my eyes, ears, tongue etc.

We must learn to be thankful to God for everything. Jonah's prayer while inside the fish's belly is most instructive (*Jonah* 2). Even though that was a cramped place, with the fish's stomach-acids falling on him, yet Jonah thanked the Lord for allowing him to be there. It was only when he began to thank the Lord, that the Lord commanded the fish to vomit Jonah out on to dry land (Read *Jonah* 2:9,10 carefully).

So don't ever complain about your house or food or circumstances. Be thankful. Many children are not thankful for their parents and their home, until they go out into the wide world and discover how tough life is. A spirit of thankfulness can deliver you from many prisons - as Jonah was delivered.

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
